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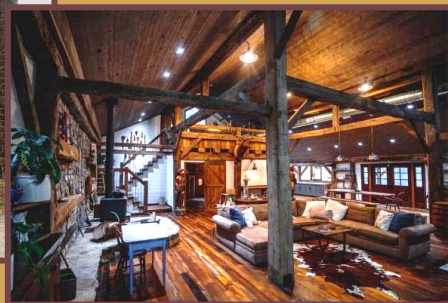
Destination 1: Friendly Acres Barn Home

We'll start the day in an 1852 barn that has been a residence for the last seven years. This 52'x36' home features double "swing beams" and a timber frame front porch and back deck. It was designed for energy efficiency and maximum use of reclaimed materials.



Destination 2: Mullenix Barn Home

This 1840-1850 hand-hewn frame was carefully moved from Georgetown, OH and is transforming into a forever home on the banks of Brush Creek. The frame features a swing beam that opens up the main living space.



Destination 3: Hart Barn Home

Once the “Dog Pound Barn” of Highland County, OH, this hand-hewn frame is now a beautiful family retreat nestled into the woods. It features lots of our reclaimed wood and an entrance that's custom-framed out of pressure-treated lumber.

Destination 4: Shawnee Hills Barn

This late 1800's frame proves that sawn frames can be just as beautiful as hand-hewn. This structure was moved from Covington, OH, and with the creativity of its owners and the BCF crew it is now a garage with office space and a third story loft. Lunch and a slide show of structures available for 2027 will be provided at this stop.
